

On the First Sunday of Lent last year, we celebrated Michelle's Ordination to the Sacred Order of Priests (top left March 1, 2020). And then sensibly, we closed in-person worship at the end of November.

# 1. You can join a small group

This Lent we will be exploring stories ~ those of relating and loving, suffering and hoping, facing dangers and difficulties, all while holding out in hope. While the current pandemic restrictions present significant challenges, the need for us to share God's love within our communities is greater than ever. Rather than just being a Lenten discipline, this year's #LiveLent is a joyful invitation to make witness a normal part of the Christian life, the natural overflow of a life lived in devotion to Christ.

Lent is like a journey. We walk towards Holy Week and Easter and remember what it means to follow Jesus. Draw round your foot. Inside the shape write "Thank you, God, for..." Add the names of the people who help you follow Jesus. Place your footprint where you will see it and it will remind you to pray for those people.



# LITURGY & WORSHIP Lent & Easter

That said, our Clergy, Staff and Production Volunteers have already begun the work of planning services throughout Lent and Easter. On February 13<sup>th</sup>, 30 people gathered via Zoom to attend a workshop lead by Dr. Wanda Malcolm. Wanda is a Professor of Pastoral Psychology at Wycliffe College (part of the Toronto School Theology at the University of Toronto). Wanda brought to us her practical and constructive perspective on self-care during Covid. A combination of scripture, teaching, self-reflection and sharing was very well received. We were delighted to have participants from as far away as Collingwood, Florida and Welland. Later on that same day Michelle lead a similarly themed workshop for our youth.

Our Clergy, Parish Visitors and Parish Callers continue to reach out via telephone to those within the parish. Pastoral needs have not subsided and we continue to adapt to the needs within our current context.

# F2021 Financial Results - Quarter 2 (December 31, 2020)

On the next page, we have published our financial position as at December 31, 2020. It represents our half-way point of our fiscal year that runs from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021. Our financial position is closely monitored at all times and we share it on a regular basis. While we do not start our start our planning for the next fiscal year until after Easter, discussions concerning our financial situation are always a big part of our monthly Corporation meetings. This is particularly true this year in the midst of the continuing pandemic restrictions and our inability to have in-person worship.

#### **Key Points:**

- Note 1: Our overall donations year over year are up 8%. This is truly remarkable and we are thankful for your steadfast faithful stewardship.
- Note 2: In Fiscal 2020, our total income included <u>extraordinary items</u> recorded as Special Donation and Designated Income. These amounts included a onetime tithe catch-up and donations made to the Hymn Book campaign and refurbishment of the outdoor signage.
- Note 3: The Rev. Michelle Jones' Curacy appointment comes to a conclusion at April 30 of this year. With her appointment comes a Diocesan curacy grant of \$1,500 per month which will end in April. We have committed to retain Michelle until the end of the fiscal year and are "cautiously optimistic" that with favourable financial results, Michelle's position will be included in our F2022 plan.
- Note 4: A modest 3% increase in salaries and benefits was approved at Vestry for Fiscal 2021. Salary and benefits were last increased in Fiscal 2019.
- Note 5: Our overall expenditures are where we would expect to see this time of year and are closely monitored. We would expect to see some increase in the area of Program Education as historically these expenses take place in the latter part of the fiscal year.

**Financial Giving:** Throughout the pandemic, Christ Church has been blessed by the ongoing generosity of our parish family. The life and vitality of our Church is important to us ~ perhaps even more so now. We are grateful to those who have played a part in ensuring our ministry continues to flourish during this unprecedented time. Intentional, purposeful and sacrificial gifts enable us to invite, welcome and connect all of us together with Him who abides with us in all times and circumstances.

Many of our Envelope Subscribers continue to make regular donations by way of the mail, drop-off, arranging for a pick-up or using an electronic method of giving. The regular monthly offerings from our PAR (pre-authorized remittance) subscribers is helpful as a way of providing a financial forecast.

- ✓ For the first six months of the fiscal year, Christ Church has received \$48,000 through E-transfers including donations to Outreach Funds & Future Ministry Fund.

- 1. You may make an **e-Transfers** via the Interac system.
  - a. Simply set-up Christ Church Brampton as a payee on your internet banking account.

  - c. No password is required
  - d. Upon making an offering you will receive an email notification as will Christ Church.
  - e. Your offering will be included in your annual tax receipt.
- 2. You can donate electronically via <u>CanadaHelps</u> using your credit card through the Christ Church Brampton website. At the top of the homepage click "Online Giving via Canada Helps". It takes you to the following link. In this case, CanadaHelps provides you with a tax receipt.
